### KNOW AND GROW - MAKATON COURSE FOR CHURCHES

As part of our drive to help churches become increasingly accessible and welcoming to all, URC Training is delighted to be able to offer subsidised access to the new KNOW AND GROW training, a Makaton course which focuses specifically on the signs you might use in worship and church-based groups. Makaton is a system of signing and using symbols to aid spoken and written communication.



Each course comprises two online sessions and you must be able to attend both. Sadly, due to limited spaces, we can offer this only to those associated with a URC church or LEP. The cost is just £18 to cover the printed manual which you will be able to keep.

Sessions are 9.30-12.30 on Friday 20 & 27 September, Saturday 21 & 28 September, Saturday 12 & 19 October

On our YouTube channel you will find a video version of the book "Step into the Story" from this year's Advent Pack as well as the four mini-books from the previous Advent Pack.



INTERGENERATE UK—a network for those in the UK engaged in Intergenerational Church—has now been launched, thanks in no small part to our own Dr Sam Richards in collaboration with an ecumenical team. Their website [Intergenerate.org](https://www.intergenerate.org) is now live and includes various items of interest, including news of a series of

webinars with guest speakers.

The first webinar is planned for 8 October from 7.30-9.00pm and looks at the theme of music in Intergenerational Church with special guests Stephen Fischbacher (Fischy Music) and Sam Hargreaves (Engage Worship). Further webinars in February and June 2025 will focus on preaching and on leadership—watch this space for further details. There will also be opportunity to network and connect with like-minded people on the intergenerational journey on Saturday 23 November at 5pm at the National Youth Ministry Weekend and also at the Hand in Hand Conference in February 2026.

## HAVE YOU BOOKED YET FOR OUR FIRST URC CHILDREN'S WORKERS TOGETHER: THE CONFERENCE ?

Running from 1 to 3 November at the beautiful Ripon College, Cuddesdon, this is an opportunity to be refreshed and encouraged in your ministry amongst children and families, whether you are an employed worker or volunteer.

Here are some highlights from the programme:

- \* **Friday : Welcome and worship, interactive getting to know you session, late-night programme and bedtime story**
- \* **Saturday: Worship and Keynote, Workshops, exploring seasonal resources and ideas, focused groups, Family Film night experience, bedtime story**
- \* **Sunday: Keynote and small groups, Worship – Brick Church**

The provisional workshops on offer are on child participation, intergenerational ministry, storytelling, and Music in ministry while the session on exploring seasonal resources and ideas offers a choice of seasons of life (eg transitions, baptisms and communion), Church in the seasons outside, seasons of the Christian calendar, and the difficult seasons (e.g. bereavement and loss, Mothers' Day etc).

There will be an exhibition of resources for you to explore and lots of opportunity to share ideas and network with others, together with chance to relax and enjoy the beautiful surroundings of Ripon College.

The cost of all this, including accommodation, meals and other refreshments, is £150 per person with some places available for day visitors. Don't forget to approach your church and your synod for financial support or grant funding. Although bookings have now closed there may be a few extra places available for latecomers. ## CHILDREN, YOUNG PEOPLE AND YOUNG ADULTS MAKING THE HEADLINES IN THE UNITED REFORMED CHURCH

11-year-old William Eneso of Thames North Synod was nominated for the Lundie Memorial Award for his witness to others, his determination to help bridge the generational gaps in his church, and his strong faith.



Kingston URC is the most recent recipient of the Children and Youth Friendly Church plaque and certificate, having worked through the reflective process looking at how they welcome, support and hear the voices of children and young people and their families. They were described as a welcoming community, where all ages are able to fully participate and have opportunities to build a relationship with God and grow in faith



Meanwhile in Yorkshire, 14-year-old Imogen Illingworth has served refreshments at church since the end of Covid and helps engage and encourage a much younger church member. Like William, Imogen shares her faith with others and brings friends to church with her when she can.


#### TALKING ABOUT ...
